

MATTHEW SLEETH

Matthew Sleeth is an Irish/Australian filmmaker, theatre director and visual artist living in New York.

Matthew's work explores the aesthetic and conceptual concerns of New Media through a diverse mix of processes including photography, film, sculpture, installation, publishing and live performance. He maintains a multi-disciplinary and collaborative practice blending the rigour of 1960s Conceptual Art with the sensory drama of the Romantics to create objects and experiences that are often political, visually ambitious and formally experimental.

Matthew's work is widely collected and held in various public collections with recent exhibitions at Carriageworks, Gertrude Contemporary, Claire Oliver Gallery and Lyon House Museum Galleries. His work has been included in a number of exhibitions at the National Gallery of Victoria: **Cats & Dogs** (2024), **Melbourne Now** (2023), **Queer** (2022), **Melbourne Now** (2013), **Negotiating This World** (2012), **Contemporary Encounters** (2010), **Long Distance Vision** (2009), **Light Sensitive** (2006) and the **Felix H. Mann Memorial Prize** (1993). In 2008 **Pattern Recognition** was installed across 32 billboards, screens, public spaces and galleries as part of the Melbourne International Arts Festival.

Matthew has contributed to a range of festivals and events including Ars Electronica (Austria), Pulse Miami, Odense Triennial (Denmark), Berlin Photography Festival, Venice Architecture Biennale, Expo Chicago, ISEA 2013, Liquid Architecture and Experimenta Biennial. He has participated in several labs and workshops including **Tropical Lab** (Singapore, 2010), Adelaide Film Festival's **Hive Lab** (2015), **Good Pitch** at the Sydney Opera House (2015) and Melbourne International Arts Festival's **Directors Lab** (2017).

Matthew's work is published in various anthology books and seven monographs: **News & Weather** (2022, Third Floor Press), **Ten Series/106 Photographs** (2007, Aperture), **Opfikon** (2004, M.33), **Survey** (2004, Josef Lebovic Gallery), **home+away** (2003, M.33), **Tour of Duty** (2002, Hardie Grant) and **The Roaring Days** (1998, M.33).

Recent projects include: **The First Cut Is the Deepest** (2021), an installation and live durational performance at **Kronenberg Mais Wright** (Sydney) inspired by Nan Goldin's iconic photograph 'Trixie on the Cot' (1979), **A Drone Opera** (2015-2020), a three-channel film installation, short film and live performance commissioned by Experimenta that is a poetic exploration of our new reality of constant surveillance; **GUILTY** (co-writer/director, 2017), a feature film set during the final 72 hours of Bali-9 drug smuggler Myuran Sukumaran, who became an accomplished artist before he was executed by Indonesian firing squad in 2015, **It Was All A Dream**, a large-scale steel and neon sculpture installed at the entrance of the 2017 Pulse Miami Fair, recent solo exhibitions at Claire Oliver Gallery (New York) include: **Various Positions** in 2009, the large-scale concrete sculptural installation **The Rise and Fall of Western Civilization (and Other Obvious Metaphors)** in 2011, **Magnificent Obsessions** in 2015 and **Rules To Live By** in 2016.

In 2014 he completed a Ph.D (New Media) at RMIT University, titled **Representation and Reproduction: A Love Story**. He is represented by Claire Oliver Gallery (New York) and Mais Wright Gallery (Sydney) and recently joined the Graduate Film program at Columbia University.
